

<b>Course Description Grade</b>	Speech: Ninth-Twelfth Grades
<b><i>Philosophy Statement:</i></b>	This course is designed to enable students to discover the significance of language through the study of formal speaking in order to become better equipped to communicate in the world for the glory of Jesus Christ.
<b><i>Course Description:</i></b>	This class will survey the various types and aspects of communication with an emphasis on developing public speaking skills. Students will learn the basic elements of the communication process and the role each of these elements plays in communication effectiveness. Students will develop their skills in speech preparation and performance competency as they prepare a variety of speeches and present them before a live audience.
